MODERNIZING PLEASURE CRAFT LICENSING PROGRAM

A pleasure craft licence (PCL) is a document issued by TC's Office of Boating Safety which contains a unique licence number used to identify vessels and licence holders.

This number allows police and search and rescue personnel to access important information in an emergency. It also supports accountability and compliance with safety and environmental regulations.



To get your PCL:

• Send your request to TC electronically (the preferred method) or by mail




After you receive your PCL:

- Carry the PCL on board the pleasure craft at all times
- Display the number on both sides of the pleasure craft's bow
- Renew your PCL every 5 years



Don't abandon your pleasure craft

Recycle or responsibly dispose of your pleasure craft





Service Standards:

Licence will be sent within 5 business days of receiving a completed application and all supporting documentation.
