PASSENGER VOLUME

FOR THE WEEK OF **AUGUST 8–14**

Daily average of passenger departures were 167,037. This is about 81% of 2019 levels.

Between January and August 2022, daily passenger volumes in Canada grew by **252%** while in comparison, U.S. daily passenger volumes grew by **64%**.

Only 2% of flights planned for Canada's top four airports over the second week of August were cancelled. This has dropped from 5% over the first week of July.







87% of passengers departing Canada's top four airports were screened by CATSA within 15 minutes over the second week of August, up from 79% of passengers over the first week of July.





Over the second week of August, 86% of flights left on time, or within one hour of their scheduled departure. This is up from under 75% for the first week of July.

Over the second week of August, 2% of arriving international flights at Toronto-Pearson airport were held on the tarmac due to congestion in the customs hall as compared to **18%** over the first week of May.
