Objectives

- Update response organization regulatory requirements to reflect current practices
- Strengthen and clarify preparedness requirements including mandatory vs. voluntary requirements
 - Move current response organization standards into regulation
 - New standards for rating response equipment capacity
 - Some updates to oil handling facility requirements to address issues
- Consolidate response organization and oil handling facility requirements into a single regulation

Proposed changes to RO requirements

Current Regulations

Response plans include general procedure and equipment requirements



Proposed Changes

Response plans to be more tailored to local conditions

Time standards for deploying/delivering response equipment



New time standard for mobilizing response plan

Evaluation of ROs:

- Implement exercise program
- Demonstrate equipment capacity



Expand exercise requirements

Formalize equipment capacity rating method

Some stakeholder participation in exercises



Increased opportunities for community & stakeholder participation

Proposed changes to OHF operator requirements

Current Regulations

Classified based on max. oil transfer rate to/from a vessel



Proposed Changes

Classify based on max. *simultaneous* transfer rate to/from multiple vessels

Must establish an exercise program



Require program to be completed within specified time frame

Post-incident and training records kept as best practice



Require post-incident and training records to be maintained

Plans must be submitted within 1 year of being updated



Updated plans to be submitted within 90 days after key events

Min. equipment requirements for OHFs south of 60



OHFs north of 60 to maintain same min. equipment requirements
